

Get vaccinated against Covid-19

Covid-19 is an infectious viral disease. Most people who get infected suffer mild illness, but some people become seriously ill. In the worst case, you can die from the disease.

Vaccination protects you and others

Vaccination against Covid-19 can protect you from becoming seriously ill or dying from the disease. Vaccination can also help to reduce the spread of Covid-19 in the community. Accordingly, it is important that many people choose to get vaccinated.

Researchers from many different countries have worked together to develop the vaccine against Covid-19. The vaccine has been tested in the same careful manner as other vaccines.

When can I get vaccinated?

Everyone aged 18 and over will be offered vaccination, but you must decide whether to get vaccinated. Even if you are not a Swedish citizen, you can still get vaccinated against Covid-19.

Getting vaccinated against Covid-19 is free of charge.

Booking a vaccination appointment

The Public Health Agency of Sweden has decided the order in which different people are to be offered vaccination. Those who most need protection against Covid-19 are to get the vaccine first. Accordingly, it is important that you stay updated about when it is your turn to book an appointment for vaccination.

You can book your vaccination appointment online. You do not need an electronic ID, but you do need a Swedish personal identity number.

If you do not have a Swedish personal identity number, you can call your health centre to book an appointment.

If you need help with translation, you can ask someone you know who speaks Swedish. If you would like an interpreter when getting vaccinated, you must inform the health centre when booking your appointment.

Continue protecting yourself and others

It is important that you continue to follow the recommendations issued by the authorities even after you have been vaccinated in order to reduce the spread of Covid-19.

- Wash your hands often.
- Keep a distance and avoid crowds.
- Meet as few people as possible.
- Stay home even if you only feel slightly unwell.
- Get tested for Covid-19 even with mild symptoms.
